Operations

- In 1950, Alcoa started manufacturing in Calhoun County, Texas (USA) with the construction of the first aluminum production facility powered by natural gas. In 1980, Alcoa discontinued aluminum production at Point Comfort Operations, and the alumina refining business, which began in 1959, has been fully curtailed since the first half of 2016.
- The site comprises 3,000 acres in total.
- With six digesters available to process raw bauxite, Point Comfort has the rated capacity to produce 2.3 million metric tons per year using the Bayer Process.

Economic Impact

- Prior to curtailment, the site employed approximately 730 employees; current employment of 46.

Community Engagement

- Invests more than \$155,000 annually in community initiatives focused on STEM education and workforce development.
- Employees volunteer every year in schools and community organizations, assisting as judges in the science fair and giving toward Toys for Tots.

Environment and Sustainability

- Stewardship through strict adherence to all environmental permits and active community engagement.
- Recycling efforts between 2012 and 2015 kept more than 10,000 tons of waste from landfills.
